Musical Elements - Tempo (Sheet 1)

Tempo tells us how fast or how slow a piece of music is played. We use **Italian** words to describe tempo. Let's see if we can identify some of those used most frequently:

Allegro Fast / Slow / Squeaky

Largo Bitter / Milky / Slowly with character

LentoSlowly / Cheekily / PiccadillyAndanteChewy / Walking Pace / BonkersVivaceFast & Lively / Sluggish / SpinachPrestoGravy / Magically / Very fast

We can measure the speed of any tempo by the number of beats per minute. We call this **bpm** for short. Sometimes if we're ill, the doctor checks our **bpm**; it's called our **pulse**.
